Remembrance Day

On Wednesday the SRC, Mrs Hick and I attended the Remembrance Day Ceremony in McCabe Park. As is always the case, Nareena Hills Public School students demonstrated respectful behaviour throughout the service and proudly represented our school.

This year marks the 97th anniversary of the Armistice which ended the First World War (1914-1918). Each year on this day Australians observe a minute's silence at 11am, in memory of those who died or suffered in all wars and armed conflicts.

Of special significance to me was to discover that Captain Mitchell O'Dwyer who delivered the address was a former student of mine from a previous school.

Thank you to the parents who provided transport and also to Mrs Hick for coordinating our attendance.





Meanwhile back at school the rest of the students and teachers also observed a minute's silence during our school service. Students made poppies in class and placed them around the school flag poles.

- advise the complainant of their rights and the process to be followed in lodging a complaint
- refer the complaint to a member of the school executive who will be responsible for resolving the complaint


School Uniforms by Poppets Direct


