#### Remembrance Day 2018

Sunday, 11 November 2018 marks the 100th anniversary of the Armistice which ended the First World War (1914-18). One hundred years ago the guns of the Western Front fell silent after four years of warfare. In the four years of war more than 330 000 Australians had served overseas, and more than 60000 of them died. The effects of war and the losses felt, shaped our nation. Each year on Remembrance Day we observe a minutes silence at 11am, in memory of those who died or suffered in wars and armed conflicts.

Our student leaders organised and led our Remembrance Day service, and at the conclusion of the event I commended them. Throughout the week I had heard that Australians are recognised globally for the fact that we commemorate the cost of war rather than celebrating the victories of war. We do not praise our wins, or celebrate the spoils of war. We choose to recognise the sacrifices and remember those who have gone before us. The conversation made me reflect on Australian values are and reminded me why I am proud to be Australian.

I am also proud to be a leader at Nareena Hills. I reiterated to our student leaders and every student in the audience that it is an honour to be a part of the Nareena Hills community. I doubt that I was the only member of our community that was filled with pride. Proud of the fact that our students commemorate days such as Remembrance Day and Anzac Day with maturity and dignity. I speak on behalf of the entire school community when I thank our leaders for their effort and organisation today.

#### Attendance Matters

Regular attendance at school is essential to assist students to maximise their potential. Recently we have noticed an increase in late arrivals and early departures. Arriving at school and class on time ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities. It also allows students to greet their friends and reduces disruption to classrooms.

If a student misses as little as 8 days in a school term, by the end of primary school they will have missed over a year of school. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons include: - being sick, or having an infectious disease

- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances

Following an absence a verbal or written explanation should be provided within 7 days.

#### Safety on our Roads

We are fortunate at Nareena Hills to have a School Crossing Supervisor Program. Our supervisors, Rachael and Erin, are committed, generous and active members of our community. Not only do they provide a service that increases mobility and safety around our school, but they do it with cheerful and positive energy. They know our children and they go above and beyond to ensure they are safe.

That is why we must as a school community act and behave in a responsible manner to support them. If you are driving, you must not proceed until the School Crossing Supervisor's hand held sign is no longer displayed, or until the supervisor indicates that you may proceed. It is also imperative that we respect our neighbours and ensure that we are parking legally and not obstructing driveways.

## Mathematics Professional Learning

On Tuesday afternoon when many people across the nation were watching a horse race, a team of mathematics enthusiasts engaged in an evening of professional learning. Mr Arrandale, Mr Casham, Miss Boess, Miss Scazzariello and I had the opportunity to listen to Professor Thomas Lowrie discuss the importance of spatial reasoning.

The aim of the learning is to increase the STEM literacy of young Australians, by using technology and innovative practices. By engaging in spatial reasoning training students increase spatial reasoning ability and mathematics and science competences. Spatial reasoning is considered critical for everyday tasks. It helps us to understand, appreciate and interpret our geometric world. Spatial reasoning is a core component of Numeracy in the Australian Curriculum. We look forward to continuing to engage in professional learning and to increase the opportunities across the school for our students to engage in learning that develops their spatial reasoning.

### P & C Meeting Week 4 Term 4

Our first P&C meeting for Term 4 was moved to Week 4 so that community members could engage in Halloween celebrations. The meeting was well attended and being Term 4 it was an opportunity to reflect on the activities of 2018. This year the P&C has assisted with Mothers' and Fathers' day stalls, the Education Week Expo, catering for a network meeting of over 42 principals, Kindergarten Expo, the orientation program, assisted with school self reflection and reviewed external validation data.

The P&C has also donated \$10 000 of funds that were utilised to purchase Bee Bots, Blue Bots, Lego Mindstorm sets and accessories. They have also purchased new stage curtains and backing curtains at a cost of \$9000, as well as committing \$3000 to improve audio visual equipment in the Hall. The COLA will be enhanced with post pads for all posts and new line markings. Monday sees the installation of a new area within the playground. After months of consultation the installers will arrive and a new play area for our students to utilise. The area will have a timber bridge, a performance platform and various rubber animals and rubber rocks. The cost for the project is \$18 000.

Equally as exciting was the discussion around tentative dates for the 2019 School Fete! The next P&C Meeting is Week 7. We meet at 7pm in the staffroom and welcome all members of the community.

#### Demountable Removal

Week 5 will be a busy week for our playground. NSW Asset Management Directorate will be relocating the demountable. The school has not used the building in 2018 and we do not have need for it in 2019, so it will be relocated to a school that has immediate use for it. We look forward to gathering the design plans of our students to turn the area into a sustainable choice learning space.

#### Semester 2 Reports

Staff are preparing and reviewing Semester 2 reports. The reports will be distributed Friday Week 8. Accompanying the reports will be a portfolio of student work. Teachers will include instructions allowing access to the portfolios. If your child's teacher does not indicate they require an interview with the Semester 2 report, it does not mean that you cannot request one. Parents may request an interview with their child's teacher at any time.

We are looking forward to a productive and engaging Term 4!

Community members, school groups, families and friends are encouraged to attend a commemorative ceremony and parade as members of the 4<sup>th</sup> / 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion exercise their Freedom of Entry to the City on Saturday 17 November.

The event will start in MacCabe Park at 1pm where the 4<sup>th</sup> / 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion will lay wreaths at the Cenotaph.

NSW Governor General David Hurley AC DSC [Ret'd] will attend the ceremony with Wollongong City Lord Mayor Councillor Gordon Bradbery AM prior to the march from the Cenotaph in MacCabe Park. The march will proceed into the City Centre, via Globe Lane and finish at the eastern end of the Mall at Kembla Street.

The ceremony commemorates the centenary of the end of World War I in November 1918.

The City welcomes the Battalion exercising their right to Freedom of Entry. The Battalion was granted Freedom of Entry in March 2004. The ceremony and parade on 17 November will recognise the vital role the 4<sup>th</sup> / 3<sup>rd</sup> battalion has played in the Australian defence forces.

Everyone is encouraged to come out and pay tribute to our local Battalion which has provided assistance to our defence forces for many years.

It is a good opportunity for all community members to see a traditional military parade through the heart of Wollongong where Battalion members will have their bayonets fixed, colours flying and music playing.

The 'Freedom of Entry to the City' is an honour that dates back to medieval times and was granted to military units that earned a city's trust. Citizens of these cities had the power to refuse entry to armed groups unless the citizens were confident of their own safety.
