#### **Principal's News**

Research consistently shows that students are reliable sources of information about the quality of our teaching, and the most useful source of ideas about how to improve it!

(MET Project, 2012; Wilkerson, Manatt, Rogers & Maughanm, 2000)

#### Student Feedback

Teachers collect feedback from students regularly throughout the year and the feedback typically focuses on thinking and understanding. We use feedback as a tool to identify the next steps in a learning journey.

In Week 7, staff were prompted to gather feedback from students on seven lessons. The difference with this feedback activity is that students were focusing on the delivery of the content, in addition to how well they understood the content.

Staff analysed responses and then shared the implications for their teaching; discussing what they would do differently after reviewing the feedback. The information allowed teachers to reflect on the opportunities that they provide in their classrooms. A popular theme discussed was engagement and staff gathered data that will assist them with developing personalised learning sequences to finish the year with.

By empowering students with the opportunity to provide feedback on lessons we are learning more about our learners and the way they learn. We can then allow them to demonstrate their knowledge and skills in a variety of ways. We are also learning about our teaching, staff were provided with valuable information about their own strengths and areas for improvement. We believe that effective teachers have high expectations of students and high expectations of themselves and their own learning.

#### Revised Kindergarten Best Start

Mrs Chin, Mrs Stone and myself participated in professional learning on 28 November. We had the opportunity to unpack the revised Best Start Assessment. The professional learning involved changes to the assessment process and unpacking of the online assessment tool. The online tool enables teachers to record detailed information about student's current literacy and numeracy skills, knowledge and understanding with information automatically transferred to PLAN2 and mapped to the National Literacy and Numeracy Learning Progressions.

#### **Technology Purchases**

This week saw the arrival of Dash and Dot Robotics sets and WeDo Lego products. These resources will allow students to learn by bringing models to life. The sets will enable science and computing skills to be refined and advanced through hands on tasks and real world projects. In an attempt to provide relevant engaging technology, we have also purchased drones for Stage 3 students to program and explore.
